



THE GOVERNOR'S OFFICE INTERNSHIP PROGRAM

The Governor's Office Internship Program is designed to provide insight to young college individuals ages 18-24 that are entering their sophomore, junior or senior year and want to learn more about the executive branch of state government. The internships are designed to provide a realistic overview of routine activity within a government office.

Staff liaisons will provide assignments and special projects to interns in their respective areas of interest. Although interns are not directly assigned to the Governor, every effort is made to give interns the opportunity to observe the Governor. This is mainly accomplished through having interns assist with proclamation ceremonies and press events in which the Governor is involved. In all cases, every effort will be made to match the intern to their selected area of interest.

The internships are divided into two, six-week sessions. Students applying are asked to list their 1st and 2nd choice for which term is best for their schedule. Hours of the internship are from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Monday through Friday.

Housing information for internships. We do not provide direct housing, but have been granted permission for our interns to contact Auburn University of Montgomery and request housing that allows our interns to stay in their dormitories. This arrangement is made directly between the student and AUM. AUM charges a very nominal fee per night but payment is made in advance for the entire stay.
