



Proclamation

By the Governor of Alabama

WHEREAS, Syringomyelia, often referred to as SM, is a chronic disorder involving the spinal cord; and

WHEREAS, the condition occurs when cerebrospinal fluid (normally found outside of the spinal cord and brain) enters the interior of the spinal cord, forming a cavity known as a syrinx. Many individuals suffer from chronic pain, and some will develop neuropathic pain syndromes and possible paralysis. This type of pain is difficult to treat. A large percentage of people with SM have severe headaches; and

WHEREAS, the need for widespread awareness and understanding for Syringomyelia is critical for meaningful research to continue so that quality of life is improved, and a cure can be found. Unfortunately, at this time a cure is unknown; and

WHEREAS, The American Syringomyelia & Chiari Alliance Project, Inc. (ASAP), the oldest non-profit organization for Chiari and Syringomyelia annually celebrates May as the official month for Syringomyelia Awareness. ASAP will continue to provide support, fund research and educate the public;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Kay Ivey, Governor of Alabama, do hereby proclaim May 2019, as

Syringomyelia Awareness Month
