



STATE OF ALABAMA
PROCLAMATION
BY THE GOVERNOR

WHEREAS, on February 23, 2019, I proclaimed a State of Emergency in specified counties within the State of Alabama in anticipation of severe weather and flooding in North Alabama;

WHEREAS, on February 27, 2019, I issued a supplemental proclamation to expand the State of Emergency to all counties impacted by this severe weather and flooding;

WHEREAS the damage caused by this severe weather and flooding required substantial emergency response and recovery efforts by state employees, including by many state employees who were required to travel away from their home base of operation to carry out such efforts; and

WHEREAS, on April 24, 2019, I issued a 60-day extension of the State of Emergency to authorize continuing reimbursement of actual and necessary expenses incurred by state employees required to travel away from their home base in response to the damage caused by this severe weather and flooding;

WHEREAS these response and recovery efforts will continue for the foreseeable future and will specifically require the services of state employees who must travel away from their home base of operations;

NOW THEREFORE, I, Kay Ivey, Governor of the State of Alabama, pursuant to section 8 of the Alabama Emergency Management Act of 1955, as amended, *see* Ala. Code § 31-9-8 (1975), and other applicable law, and upon the recommendation of the director of the Alabama Emergency Management Agency, do hereby proclaim the continuing existence of conditions warranting a second 60-day extension of the State of Emergency I proclaimed on February 23, 2019. This second extension shall be effective as of June 23, 2019. For the duration of this additional 60-day extension, I authorize and direct the reimbursement of actual and necessary expenses, as prescribed by the Fiscal Policies and Procedures Manual, for state employees who have been, are being, or may be called to service away from their home base during this State of Emergency. All such claims for expense reimbursement must be reasonable and must be certified as such by the claiming employee, according to applicable law, and must be approved by the employee's department head or appointing authority.
