



STATE OF ALABAMA
PROCLAMATION
BY THE GOVERNOR

WHEREAS, authenticated information has reached this office regarding the death of an unidentified child whose skeletal remains were discovered on January 28, 2012 near an Opelika trailer park in Lee County, Alabama;

WHEREAS, information indicates that the Jane Doe was of African-American descent and would have been between 4 and 7 years of age at the time of death; and,

WHEREAS, it appears foul play is suspected and the perpetrator of this probable crime is currently unknown and there are no suspects.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Kay Ivey, by virtue of the power and authority vested in me as Governor of the State of Alabama under §15-9-3, Code of Alabama, 1975, do hereby issue this proclamation, offering a reward of \$5,000 for information leading to the arrest and conviction of the perpetrator provided there has been no arrest of same at the time of issuance of this proclamation, and entitlement to this reward shall include only private citizens and shall not include members or employees of any government law enforcement agency or their relatives.
