



STATE OF ALABAMA
PROCLAMATION
BY THE GOVERNOR

WHEREAS, on October 6, 2020, I proclaimed the existence of a state of emergency based on the imminent threat of Hurricane Delta, which at the time had the potential to make landfall in or near Mobile and Baldwin Counties;

WHEREAS that initial proclamation and a subsequent supplemental proclamation I issued later that day included provisions to assist the people of Alabama prepare for, mitigate, and recover from the anticipated impacts of Hurricane Delta;

WHEREAS those provisions included, among other provisions, an order, rule, or regulation requiring the evacuation of certain persons from Dauphin Island and certain portions of south Baldwin County effective October 7, 2020, at 7:00 a.m.; and

WHEREAS it now appears that Hurricane Delta is unlikely to make landfall in Mobile or Baldwin Counties and that the mandatory evacuation order is therefore no longer necessary to assist in preparing for, mitigating, or recovering from the impacts of that storm;

NOW THEREFORE, I, Kay Ivey, Governor of the State of Alabama, pursuant to the relevant provisions of the Alabama Emergency Management Act of 1955, as amended, Ala. Code §§ 31-9-1 *et seq.*, do hereby proclaim the existence of conditions that warrant implementation of additional extraordinary measures and relief during the state of emergency now in effect. I therefore proclaim and direct the following:

I. Mandatory evacuation of coastal tourists and vacationers

Effective immediately, the mandatory-evacuation provision contained in section 1 of my first supplemental emergency proclamation dated October 6, 2020, is hereby rescinded.

FURTHER, to the extent a provision in this supplemental proclamation conflicts with any provision of state law, that law is hereby suspended for the duration of this state of emergency, and this proclamation shall control.

FURTHER, I declare that this proclamation, and all subsequent orders, laws, rules, or regulations issued pursuant hereto, shall remain in full force and effect for the duration of this state of emergency, except as otherwise expressly specified.

IN WITNESS, WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal to be affixed by the Secretary of State at the State Capitol in the City of Montgomery on this the 8th day of October 2020.
