



STATE OF ALABAMA
PROCLAMATION
BY THE GOVERNOR

WHEREAS, on October 6, 2020, I proclaimed the existence of a state of emergency based on the imminent threat of Hurricane Delta, and which at the time had the potential to make landfall in or near Mobile and Baldwin Counties;

WHEREAS the initial proclamation and subsequent supplemental proclamations I issued later included provisions to assist the people of Alabama prepare for, mitigate, and recover from the anticipated impacts of Hurricane Delta;


WHEREAS Hurricane Delta did not make landfall in Mobile or Baldwin Counties and the state of emergency is therefore no longer necessary to assist in preparing for, mitigating, or recovering from the impacts of the storm; and

WHEREAS, upon the recommendation of officials at the Alabama Emergency Management Agency, and after consultation with other affected persons and entities, it is hereby determined that such conditions no longer exist in the State of Alabama;

NOW THEREFORE, I, Kay Ivey, Governor of the State of Alabama, pursuant to the relevant provisions of the Alabama Emergency Management Act of 1955, as amended, Ala. Code §§ 31-9-1 *et seq.*, do hereby proclaim that the state of emergency pertaining to Hurricane Delta proclaimed on October 6, 2020, is terminated effective immediately.
