By the Governor of Alabama

WHEREAS, preserving and understanding our American Heritage are intrinsic values that will serve us throughout our lives, bind us together and allow us to better understand the foundation of our country; and

WHEREAS, our citizen leaders envision a future where educational and service organizations of all manner, support education of our youth in the fields of American History, Education, Law, Political Sciences and other related fields; and

WHEREAS, parents seek to provide Patriotic education for our youth and public awareness about the important events, significant persons, and philosophical bases of the American Revolutionary period, the Constitution and approaching 250th Anniversary of the Declaration of Independence; and

WHEREAS, establishing a National American History Month will enhance greater awareness and support through educational publications, programs, historic tours, scholarships, as well as initiatives to encourage other organizations to engage in similar efforts; and
