



STATE OF ALABAMA
PROCLAMATION
BY THE GOVERNOR

WHEREAS, on June 21, 2021, I proclaimed the existence of a state of emergency based on the imminent threat of severe weather posed by Tropical Storm Claudette;

WHEREAS the initial proclamation included provisions to assist the citizens of Alabama prepare for, mitigate, and recover from the anticipated impacts of Tropical Storm Claudette;


WHEREAS Tropical Storm Claudette has subsided, and the state of emergency is therefore no longer necessary to assist in preparing for, mitigating, or recovering from the impacts of the storm; and

WHEREAS, upon the recommendation of officials at the Alabama Emergency Management Agency, and after consultation with other affected persons and entities, it is hereby determined that such conditions no longer exist in the State of Alabama;

NOW THEREFORE, I, Kay Ivey, Governor of the State of Alabama, pursuant to the relevant provisions of the Alabama Emergency Management Act of 1955, as amended, Ala. Code §§ 31-9-1 *et seq.*, do hereby proclaim that the state of emergency pertaining to Tropical Storm Claudette proclaimed on June 21, 2021, is terminated effective 11:59 p.m. C.S.T. today, July 20, 2021.
