WHEREAS, the state of Alabama is committed, engaged and supportive of older adults, their families and caregivers; and

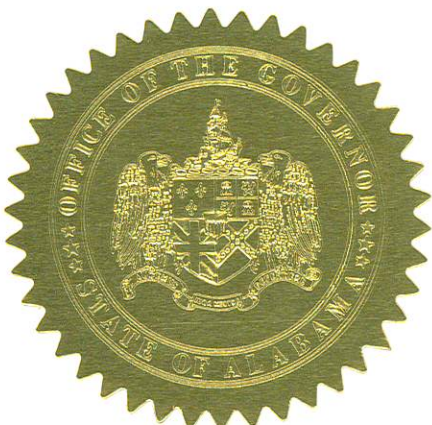
WHEREAS, we acknowledge the importance of bringing together all generations and engaging in activities that promote physical, mental and emotional well-being for the benefit of all; and
