WHEREAS, it is estimated about 1 in 100,000 individuals are born with this condition; and

WHEREAS, people living with this condition may also suffer from hypertonia, epilepsy, swallowing disorders, developmental delays and more; and

WHEREAS, addressing the complex medical needs early in life is imperative to helping families successfully care for their children at home; and

WHEREAS, it is appropriate that one day each year should be set apart from the rest and be known as Lissencephaly Awareness Day; and

WHEREAS, Lissencephaly Foundation, Inc. is a nonprofit charitable organization that works to help support these individuals through our continued efforts of empowering families and educating communities;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Kay Ivey, Governor of Alabama, do hereby proclaim September 8, 2021, as
