WHEREAS, the United States Congress, by joint resolution on April 30, 1934 and modified in 1968, proclaimed the second Monday of October of each year as "Columbus Day"; and

WHEREAS, Italian Americans have enriched the cultural life of the state they helped build; and

WHEREAS, Alabama is proud to be home to a distinguished population and recognizes the success Italian American men and women have made throughout the state;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Kay Ivey, Governor of Alabama, do hereby proclaim October 2022, as

Italian American Heritage Month
