By the Governor of Alabama

WHEREAS, October 2022 marks the 77th anniversary of National Disability Employment Awareness Month; and

WHEREAS, the purpose of National Disability Employment Awareness Month is to educate about disability employment issues and celebrate the many and varied contributions of America's workers with disabilities; and

WHEREAS, in recognition to the vital role people with disabilities play in the workforce, the U.S. Department of Labor announced that "Disability: Part of the Equity Equation" has been chosen as the theme for October's National Disability Employment Awareness Month; and

WHEREAS, workplaces welcoming the talents of all people, including people with disabilities, are a critical part of our efforts to build an inclusive community and strong economy; and
