By the Governor of Alabama

WHEREAS, forestry is an integral part of Alabama. The forest products industry provides jobs, products and recreational opportunities for all; and

WHEREAS, Woods to Goods Week began in 2020 during the third week of October and has since involved many public officials, students, state employees, and of course, loggers, foresters, and manufacturing facility employees. Woods to Goods Week accomplished nine legislative mill tours, eight log site visits, a forestry career day, a legislative learn and burn and several other educational events to celebrate the forest industry throughout the state; and

WHEREAS, Alabama's 23.1 million acres of healthy forests provides the raw materials to supply a thriving forest products industry. Thanks to responsible sustainability practices, there are more trees in the state today than ever before. Over 49,000 Alabamians are directly employed by the forest products industry.
