

Proclamation

By the Governor of Alabama

WHEREAS, the National Society Magna Charta Dames and Barons was established to perpetrate the memory of the Barons of England who in and before the year 1215 rendered actual service towards securing, and who, after many defeats, finally did secure the articles of constitutional liberty, properly called Magna Charta, from their sovereign, John, King of England, which he ratified and delivered to them "in the meadow which he called Runnemede between Windsor and Staines," on the Thames above London on the 15th day of June, A.D. 1215; and

WHEREAS, Magna Charta Dames and Barons strive to promote good fellowship among the descendants of those who compelled King John to grand the Magna Charta; and

WHEREAS, National Society Magna Charta Dames and Barons goal is to inspire members of the Society and others with the admiration to and respet for the principles of constitutional government, first established by the statutes of the Great Charter granted by King John; and

WHEREAS, National Society Magna Charta Dames and Barons desire to keep ever in mind the events connected with the most celebrated episode in the annals of the English race;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Kay Ivey, Governor of Alabama, do hereby proclaim November 5^{th} , 2024, as

Magna Charta Day

in the state of Alabama.
