By the Governor of Alabama

WHEREAS, moms and babies face serious health risks and March of Dimes fights for their health through research, education advocacy, and programs; and

WHEREAS, March of Dimes has developed a collaborative model to study and prevent preterm birth through groundbreaking research at five Prematurity Research Centers; and

WHEREAS, March of Dimes is committed to mobilizing the nation by amplifying the voices of women and families; and

WHEREAS, 7,461 babies were born preterm in 2022 in the state of Alabama, representing 12.8 percent of all state births; and

WHEREAS, in Alabama, March of Dimes has worked extensively to extend postpartum Medicaid to 12 months and work on programs to address the maternity care deserts, including Mom & Baby Mobile Health Centers; and

WHEREAS, March of Dimes looks forward to partnering with the state of Alabama in response to the continued maternal and infant health crisis of prematurity; and'

WHEREAS, the month of November is recognized as Prematurity Awareness, Month and November 17 is recognized as World Prematurity Day to raise awareness;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Kay Ivey, Governor of Alabama, do hereby proclaim November 17, 2024, as
