## *By the Governor of Alabama*

*WHEREAS, the emerging global economy makes active engagement with other countries and cultures critical to our progress as a nation and as institutions; and*

*WHEREAS, Troy University, known as Alabama's International University, enrolls students from around the world; and*

*WHEREAS, Troy University operates teaching sites in Japan, South Korea, Malaysia and Vietnam, where Troy became the first U.S. university to award the baccalaureate degree; and*

*WHEREAS, Troy University has enabled all students to benefit from exposure to classmates from different nations and cultures, with the goal of preparing them to excel in the international marketplace that awaits them after graduation; and*

*WHEREAS, the international students who study in our great nation return home as goodwill ambassadors for Alabama and the United States of America; and*

*WHEREAS, international education has an annual impact of almost \$34 billion on the U.S. economy and an annual impact of approximately \$262 million to Alabama's economy;*
