By the Governor of Alabama

WHEREAS, school social workers are skilled in identifying and providing services to students who face substantial challenges to academic success, including poverty, disability, discrimination, abuse, addiction, bullying, grief, loss and other obstacles; and

WHEREAS, school social workers serve as the vital link between school, home and the community, doing impactful work to address students' physical and mental health needs so that students may achieve academic success; and

WHEREAS, school social workers provide intervention, crisis support and mental health counseling to ensure that Alabama students may reach their full potential in the classroom, addressing truancy and behavioral interventions; and

WHEREAS, during this week, the state of Alabama celebrates School Social Work Week and highlights the important work school social workers do to assist students, administrators, teachers, educators, parents and their communities;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Kay Ivey, Governor of Alabama, do hereby proclaim March 2 through March 8, as
