

Proclamation

By the Governor of Alabama

WHEREAS, the state of Alabama is committed to ensuring the safety and security of all those living in and visiting our state; and

WHEREAS, a sufficient blood supply is a public safety issue both locally and nationally, and our hospitals and medical centers need a readily available supply for our residents and visitors; and

WHEREAS, one blood donation can help save more than one life, and although most of the U.S. population is eligible to donate blood, only about three percent actually do; and

WHEREAS, Alabama is home to a number of committed public service and private organizations working to raise awareness about the importance of blood donation, including the Vitalant, American Red Cross, the Dr. Daliah Show and others; and

WHEREAS, the Alabama Blood Donation Day effectively serves to remind us that we need to constantly replenish our blood supply through donation and community awareness:

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Kay Ivey, Governor of Alabama do hereby proclaim September 4, 2025, as

Alabama Blood Donation Day

in the state of Alabama, and I urge all the people of our state to support our local blood drives as saving lives and protecting our citizens is our primary goal.
