

Proclamation

By the Governor of Alabama

WHEREAS, more than 43 million Americans lack basic reading and writing skills, and an additional 62.7 million Americans lack the skills necessary to succeed in post-secondary education; and

WHEREAS, the United States is short an estimated 7.5 million private sector workers across all skill levels; and

WHEREAS, the state of Alabama's Adult Education programs remain dedicated to mitigating these societal and economic challenges by furnishing tuition-free foundational instruction, facilitating the attainment of high school equivalency credentials and advancing opportunities afforded through the recently enacted REACH Act; and

WHEREAS, Alabama's Adult Education programs seek to mitigate barriers to education such as transportation and childcare through partnerships with the Paths for Success Foundation and other local nonprofit organizations; and

WHEREAS, Alabama's Adult Education programs prepare Alabamians for in-demand careers through contextualized programs such as Integrated Education and Training (IET), Alabama Career Essentials (ACE) and Mobilizing Alabama Pathways (MAPs); and

WHEREAS, Alabama's Adult Education programs offer free education and in-demand credentials sought by Alabama employers; and

WHEREAS, the state of Alabama proudly celebrates the achievements of Adult Education faculty and staff in helping students achieve education, credentials, diplomas, degrees and employment:
