

## Proclamation

## By the Governor of Alabama

WHEREAS, the state of Alabama continues to develop effective guidelines, which actively support consistent school attendance for students and K-12 families; and

WHEREAS, students who miss substantial classroom time, especially in their early grades, can adversely affect their educational skills in reading and math; and

WHEREAS, chronic absence is often defined as a student missing 18 or more days of school for any reason, both excused and unexcused absences; and

WHEREAS, our state must remain vigilant in addressing any barriers, which may negatively impact student academic achievement and daily school attendance; and

WHEREAS, with the continued support of local families and communities, Alabama students can achieve their personal goals and graduation aspirations; and

WHEREAS, chronic absence can significantly undermine local, regional and state efforts to provide a quality educational experience to all students; and

WHEREAS, our state's keen focus on K-12 achievement has helped to expand reading success in our state and placed emphasis on early literacy preparedness; and

WHEREAS, these efforts are enriching our local communities and are often ultimately successful because of students' regular classroom attendance; and

WHEREAS, chronic absences are substantially reduced when schools, local communities, and parents work together to encourage excellent class attendance; and

WHEREAS, consistent school attendance truly provides great opportunities for all students to develop the essential skills required for a lifetime of academic success:

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Kay Ivey, Governor of Alabama, do hereby proclaim September 2025, as
