

## Proclamation

## By the Governor of Alabama

WHEREAS, Farm-City Week was first observed in 1955 as a way to foster stronger relationships among farmers and their urban and suburban neighbors; and

WHEREAS, Alabama has continually celebrated Farm-City the week before Thanksgiving for 69 years; and

WHEREAS, Farm-City Week is a time to express gratitude for the bounty of the land as well as the people who've made America's food and fiber system the envy of the world; and

WHEREAS, Alabama is home to 37,362 farms, of which 95% are family farms or partnerships; and

WHEREAS, the annual economic contribution of Alabama's food, fiber, forestry and green industries is \$78 billion, and those industries account for 276,425 jobs; and

WHEREAS, on average, each American farmer produces enough food for his family and 166 people in the U.S. and around the world; and

WHEREAS, farmers conserve Alabama's abundant natural resources by providing wildlife habitat; reducing erosion through conservation tillage; and increasing efficiency with precision agriculture, improved genetics and biotechnology; and

WHEREAS, farmers rely on their non-farm partners for supplies, financing, marketing, equipment, labor, technology and more; and

WHEREAS, Farm-City Week celebrates the interconnectedness and mutually beneficial relationships in America's food and fiber system:

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Kay Ivey, Governor of Alabama, do hereby proclaim November 26 through December 3, 2025, as
