By the Governor of Alabama

WHEREAS, the families of first responders also share in this noble calling, offering steadfast support and enduring countless sacrifices as their loved ones serve on the front lines; and

WHEREAS, the dedication and selflessness of Alabama's first responders inspire gratitude and respect from all Alabamians and serve as a lasting reminder of the courage that strengthens our state and its people:
