



Proclamation

By the Governor of Alabama

WHEREAS, radon is a colorless, odorless and tasteless radioactive gas that is produced when uranium breaks down in soil and water; and

WHEREAS, radon can be a serious health risk to Alabamians when it is trapped in buildings; and

WHEREAS, radon is the second leading cause of lung cancer in the United States, the number one cause of lung cancer among nonsmokers and the cause of more than 21,000 deaths annually; and

WHEREAS, it is estimated that one in 15 homes in the United States has elevated radon levels; and

WHEREAS, the Environmental Protection Agency and the U.S. Surgeon General urge all Americans to protect their health by testing for radon because exposure to radon is a preventable health risk and testing radon levels in your home can help prevent unnecessary exposure; and

WHEREAS, if a high radon level is detected in your home, steps can be taken to mitigate the problem:

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Kay Ivey, Governor of Alabama, do hereby proclaim January 2026 as

Radon Action Month

in the state of Alabama and draw attention to the importance of protecting yourself and your family by testing for radon levels every two years and remedying the problem if found.
