



STATE OF ALABAMA PROCLAMATION BY THE GOVERNOR

WHEREAS, on January 22, 2026, in response to severe winter weather, I proclaimed a state of emergency pursuant to the Alabama Emergency Management Act of 1955, due to conditions of disaster and of extreme peril to the safety of persons and property in the following counties: Blount, Cherokee, Colbert, Cullman, DeKalb, Etowah, Fayette, Franklin, Jackson, Lamar, Lauderdale, Lawrence, Limestone, Madison, Marion, Marshall, Morgan, Walker, and Winston;

WHEREAS, on January 26, 2026, I supplemented the state of emergency to include additional counties impacted by the severe weather, including Geneva, Houston, and Montgomery Counties;


WHEREAS, upon the recommendation of officials at the Alabama Emergency Management Agency, and after consultation with other affected persons and entities, it has been determined that such conditions no longer exist in the State of Alabama;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Kay Ivey, Governor of the State of Alabama, do hereby declare that the State of Emergency proclaimed on January 22, 2026, and supplemented on January 26, 2026, is terminated effective 11:59 p.m. CST, on February 2, 2026.

BE IT ORDERED that the appropriate Alabama state agencies are hereby instructed to resume their normal state of business and day-to-day operations.
