



STATE OF ALABAMA
PROCLAMATION
BY THE GOVERNOR

WHEREAS, on January 15, 2018, I proclaimed a State of Emergency under the Alabama Emergency Management Act of 1955, as amended, due to conditions of disaster and extreme peril to the safety of persons and property within the State caused by the winter storm system; and

WHEREAS, at the request of officials at the Alabama Emergency Management Agency and after consultation with other affected parties and entities, I have determined that a State of Emergency no longer exists in the State of Alabama;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Kay Ivey, Governor of the State of Alabama, do hereby proclaim that the State of Emergency declared on January 15, 2018, is terminated effective at 12:00 a.m. on January 20, 2018.

BE IT ORDERED that the appropriate Alabama state agencies are hereby instructed to resume their normal state of business and day-to-day operations. Nothing herein is intended to terminate the exemptions from Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations for motor carriers and drivers transporting heating fuel, including natural gas, propane, and heating oil, into and from the State of Alabama, which are currently in effect pursuant to the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration's Extension of Regional Declaration of Emergency, dated January 10, 2018, and in accordance with the restrictions and limitations set forth therein. *See* Emergency Declarations, Waivers, Exemptions and Permits, <https://www.fmcsa.dot.gov/emergency>.
