



Proclamation

By the Governor of Alabama

WHEREAS, the state of Alabama is a participant in the National Main Street Program, a subsidiary of the National Trust for Historic Preservation, which brings national attention to the downtown revitalization of our cities and expert technical assistance and training to the program's participants; and

WHEREAS, the Main Street Alabama program is a community-based, self-help program aimed at reversing the decline of central business districts, returning main streets to their traditional role as the centers of social and commercial activity and creating a healthy economic basis for growth; and prosperity and

WHEREAS, the citizens and officials in these communities have rallied together and organized to compete for the right to participate in the program through demonstration of commitment to the Four-Point Approach of the National Main Street Center implementation of a successful program of organization, design, promotion and economic vitality for their central business district and dedication to become a successful model of downtown revitalization for the state; and

WHEREAS, the organization is celebrating its 5th Anniversary and in that time, has recorded these statistics as evidence of their progress in revitalizing commercial districts: \$283,215,181 in private investment, \$79,823,821 in public investment, a net gain of 488 new businesses, a net gain of 1,959 new jobs and 61,766 volunteer hours; and

WHEREAS, in fiscal year 2018, Main Street Alabama will work with Alexander City, Anniston, Athens, Birmingham, Columbiana, Decatur, Dothan, Elba, Eufaula, Florence, Fort Payne, Gadsden, Heflin, Jasper, Marion, Monroeville, Montevallo, Opelika, Oxford, Scottsboro, South Huntsville and Wetumpka, and add more communities in Spring 2019, to continue growing this economic revitalization program across the great state of Alabama;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Kay Ivey, Governor of Alabama, do hereby proclaim August 23, 2018, as

Main Street Alabama Day

in the State of Alabama.
