## By the Governor of Alabama

*WHEREAS, every year, on April 28, communities and workplaces across the United States observe Workers Memorial Day to honor the men and women who have lost their lives or have been injured on the job, and to recommit ourselves to improving workplace safety for all; and*

*WHEREAS, the Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) has played a crucial role in setting and enforcing standards that have significantly reduced workplace injuries, illnesses and fatalities since its establishment; and*

*WHEREAS, despite progress, thousands of American workers continue to be affected by occupational hazards each year, underscoring the need for ongoing vigilance, education and enforcement of safety measures; and*

*WHEREAS, Workers Memorial Day serves as a solemn reminder of the sacrifices made by workers and their families and as an opportunity to renew our commitment to safe and healthful working conditions for all people; and*

*WHEREAS, the state of Alabama recognizes the importance of honoring fallen workers, supporting those who have been injured and promoting a culture of safety and respect throughout our workplaces:*

*NOW, THEREFORE, I, Kay Ivey, Governor of Alabama, do hereby proclaim April 28, 2026, as*
