



Proclamation

By the Governor of Alabama

WHEREAS, the men and women of law enforcement throughout the state of Alabama serve with courage, integrity and dedication to protecting the lives, property and constitutional rights of our citizens; and

WHEREAS, law enforcement officers work tirelessly each day to preserve public safety, prevent crime, respond to emergencies, assist those in need and strengthen the communities they serve while willingly placing themselves in harm's way and making personal sacrifices in service to others, demonstrating an unwavering commitment to safeguarding our state; and

WHEREAS, National Law Enforcement Week provides an opportunity to recognize the invaluable contributions of law enforcement officers, honor those who have made the ultimate sacrifice in the line of duty and express our gratitude to the families who support them; and

WHEREAS, public safety remains a shared responsibility, and law enforcement agencies across Alabama continue to educate and enforce laws that protect motorists and boaters from impaired operation; and

WHEREAS, the Alabama Law Enforcement Agency (ALEA), in partnership with local, state and federal agencies will participate in the national Operation Dry Water campaign to combat boating under the influence and promote safe recreation on Alabama's waterways; and

WHEREAS, ALEA and law enforcement agencies statewide will also support the national Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over campaign to reduce impaired driving and encourage responsible decision-making on Alabama's roadways; and

WHEREAS, operating a vehicle or vessel while impaired places lives at risk and undermines the safety of our communities, and Alabama remains committed to promoting responsible behavior and preventing needless tragedies;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Kay Ivey, Governor of Alabama, do hereby proclaim June 13 through 21, 2026, as
