By the Governor of Alabama

WHEREAS, Alabama's schools significantly impact the nutrition students receive and their development of healthy eating habits; and

WHEREAS, Alabama does best when state agencies and community partners collaborate to achieve common goals and lift up children and families; and

WHEREAS, Farm to School enriches the connection communities have with fresh, healthy food and local food producers by changing food purchasing and education practices at schools and preschools; and

WHEREAS, Farm to School supports students' access to healthy, local foods and educational opportunities, including school gardens, cooking lessons and farm field trips; and

WHEREAS, Farm to School empowers children and their families to make informed food choices and strengthens the local economy, which contributes to vibrant communities:
