By the Governor of Alabama

WHEREAS, throughout our nation's history, our leaders have called upon the people to seek the guidance, mercy and blessing of Almighty God, particularly in times of difficulty and uncertainty; and

WHEREAS, we recognize that prayer and fasting provide an opportunity for Alabamians to humble themselves before God, seek His forgiveness and ask for His wisdom, protection and grace upon our families, communities, state and nation; and

WHEREAS, freedom to worship, practice one's faith and live according to one's convictions is essential to our free society. Alabama has a proud history of protecting religious freedom and liberty, and we remain committed to safeguarding these fundamental rights for all Alabamians; and

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Kay Ivey, Governor of Alabama, do hereby proclaim September 2026, as a
